Code of Conduct for NCPG Volunteers

Updated November 2024

NCPG volunteers serving on committees, professional resource networks, or work groups agree that the following standards shall guide their work.

Parameters

- Recognize that volunteer committees and groups are entities of NCPG, authorized and charged by the organization.
- Committees and other sub entities of NCPG may not speak on behalf of NCPG or the Board of Directors without specific authorization.
- Volunteers on board committees must adhere to all relevant laws and abide by relevant policies and agreements, including the Code of Conduct and Conflict of Interest.

Participation

- Demonstrate subject matter expertise or interest in the group's focus.
- Understand and actively help advance NCPG's strategic priorities.
- Attend scheduled gatherings and actively contribute to the group's work; for Board and staff committees only, members missing three or more consecutive meetings may be removed.
- Comply with the bylaws and all other applicable policies, procedures, agreements, and requirements.

Relationships

- Maintain a mutually respectful, collaborative, and supportive working environment with other members.
- Get to know others in the group and build collegial working relationships that respect the rights of others to hold and express differing opinions and contribute to consensus building.
- Participate fully and frankly in the deliberations and discussions of the group.
- Work collaboratively with staff, observe established lines of communication, and direct requests for information or assistance to the designated staff for your group.

As a valued NCPG volunteer, I hereby pledge to serve in a trustworthy and diligent manner and abide by the NCPG Code of Conduct. I understand that failure to abide by this Code of Conduct may result in my removal as a group member, pursuant to the requirements and processes provided in the organization's governing documents and agreements.
